IN THE WORKS

We know that therapeutic intervention for special needs children drastically improves their quality of life, yet many children around the world receive only sporadic support, if any. Consistent access to trained professionals is key and our programs provide training and additional hands on deck to make this happen.

Custom splints and bracing support fit each child in a way that provides range of motion and enhanced movements while decreasing pain and discomfort.

We are excited that share that in 2023, we will be opening a splinting clinic in Jamaica! At our splinting clinic, children will be fitted for custom splints to support individual needs. Custom splinting is essential in providing protection and support that meets individual needs for optimal quality of life. Custom splinting or bracing can provide additional comfort and mobility that will not exist from hand-me-down products, which is a huge reason we are excited to be able to bring this to kids in Jamaica.

All splints and bracing will be provided at no costs to children and their families.

Our clinic will also provide education and training to island professionals on how to prepare custom splints, so that they may continue to use our supplies and provide this service during times that volunteers, fellows or sponsored therapists are not available.

The final location of our splinting clinic is being finalized in January 2023. We are looking forward to sharing updates of our project in 2023!

ITTS PROGRAM PAVES WAY FOR INCREASED 'AUTISM—FRIENDLY' APPROACH IN JAMAICA

In our world, information and technology is constantly changing. This makes the need for continuing education essential for occupational therapists to maintain clinical excellence and update their skills, knowledge and technique to best serve patients.

Thanks to our Interdisciplinary Team Training Series (ITTS) program, we were able to sign up four (4) professional therapists in Jamaica for a virtual conference, 'Autism: Beyond Limits' in Fall 2022.

Since, we have surveyed and met with a few of the participants on what the experience has meant both personally and professionally.

After the conference was complete, we reached out to learn what participants thought of their experience and how it will impact their work with kids in Jamaica.

The individuals who participated in the follow-up survey included:

The group in general agreed that the conference was very practical, and each professional walked away with ideas to improve their services. One example was a meltdown session (a time when a child is having a tantrum and is unable to self regulate), which explored different intervention techniques to prevent meltdowns or at least reduce their severity. The session offered tips on assessing behavior leading up to a meltdown in order to redirect before a major meltdown occurs.

The group also enjoyed sessions that focused on helping children to key into their individual strengths and interests.


